

Getting Started with Dual Enrollment

What is Dual Enrollment?

High school students can earn Grove City College credits at a reduced rate by participating in our Dual Enrollment program. Students can select online courses from across the disciplines, learn from Grove City College's renowned faculty, and potentially fulfill their first year of college requirements while still in high school.

How do students apply to the Dual Enrollment Program?

New Students: New students must submit the <u>Dual Enrollment Application for Admission</u>, <u>School</u> <u>Authorization Form</u>, <u>Parental Consent Form</u>, and their official high school transcript. Additional details for new students can be found on the <u>Dual Enrollment site</u>.

Returning Students: Returning students can register for courses through my.gcc.edu. Additional details for returning students can be found on the <u>Dual Enrollment site</u>.

What are the deadlines?

New students must submit all application materials one week before classes begin. Course enrollment is processed in the order in which the request was received. Additional deadline details can be found on the <u>Dual Enrollment site</u>.

Which courses are offered?

Students can find a list of courses on the Dual Enrollment site and can find sample syllabi on our blog.

Which courses should a student take?

Advising guides are useful to help students determine their path through the start of college. On the <u>Advising Guides page</u>, select the top date range under "Status Sheets" and then select the major of interest. The first page of the guide indicates the required Grove City College courses; the second page indicates a suggested order in which courses should be taken.

Which books should a student purchase?

Students can find the list of required materials on the <u>Grove City Bookstore website</u>. Faculty will also list the required materials in the syllabus.

Where can I find an Academic Calendar?

Academic calendars are on the Grove City College site.

How does Grove City College rank nationally?

Grove City has earned <u>numerous accolades</u> through the years. For instance, *US News and World Report* ranks Grove City College in the top tier of Best National Liberal Arts Colleges based on a number of factors, including graduation and retention rates, faculty quality, student selectivity, financial resources, assessments by other colleges and high school counselors, and alumni giving. *The Princeton Review* ranks Grove City College #8 in the list of Top 25 Best Schools for Internships, and PayScale ranks Grove City College in the top 12 percent of Best Value Colleges based on ROI (return on investment).

Do you offer financial aid?

Although Grove City College offers a variety of <u>financial resources</u> for matriculated students, financial aid is not available for Dual Enrolled students.

Is Grove City accredited?

Grove City College is accredited by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education, an institutional accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Secretary of Education and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation.
